

Dear Parent:

Catholic Charities Tri-County Services (Camp Scully) is participating in the Summer Food Service Program. For all our Overnight Programs, meals will be provided to all children free of charge and are included in the camp fee and Financial Assistance program. Children who are part of households that receive SNAP benefits under the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), or Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) are automatically eligible to receive free meals through this program. The following 2023-2024 income eligibility standards will be used for determining eligibility for free meals:


